
On Monday, January 20, people will gather at the County Courthouse to start the march from there to the Lewisburg United Methodist Church where they will gather for a community meal and afternoon of special activity honoring the memory of Dr. King and his message as to changing the world.

The keynote speaker will be The Rev. Dr. Joseph N. Evans, the Dean of Morehouse School of Religion and the Senior Pastor of Mount Carmel Baptist Church, Washington, D.C. He has served as an adjunct instructor of homiletics at The Divinity School, Howard University and Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C.

All of the events start at 11:00am with the beginning of the march from the courthouse to the church. After the free lunch the events take place in the church sanctuary starting at 12:30 pm.

Not only is this a grand event of the community coming together, but it is a time for each of us to reflect on the message of who we are as a people. This is also an opportunity to participate in the largest MLK celebration in the State of West Virginia.

SESSION NEWS and NOTES

The Session of Clifton Presbyterian Church met December 8 for the stated December meeting in the Conference Room of the church. Those in attendance were moderator, Larryetta Ellis; temporary pastor, Ron Miller; session members: Kereshmeh Kashefian, Jim Miller, Suzy Meadows, Carol Hoover, Venetta Wright and Houston Arbuckle, clerk of session. Larry Davis, Teresa Bostic and James Meadows were excused. The newly elected session members were examined and approved by the session.

Following the approval of the 2020 session members, the session received the November financial report. The General fund showed an excess income of \$1,835.16. The General now has a balance of \$192,784.17. The Memorial fund received \$80.00 from park donations. This left a balance of 45,744.48. The Stone Soup fund had a balance \$3,569.07.

Worship attendance for our Thanksgiving Dinner was 48. Clifton will celebrate the Lord's Supper on January 12th—Baptism of the Lord Sunday.

Jim Miller, Chair of the Property Committee reported that Mike Reed had been hired to help **Buddy Baker** with church maintenance.

Suzy Meadows, Co-Chair of the Education and Congregation Care Committee reported members of Clifton's Choir were planning Christmas Caroling to our shut-ins; the Christian Education Committee is considering having a "Matthew 25" study early in 2020 and the committees recommend giving each of the Osteopathic students who has helped in the nursey a \$10 gift card. This was approved by the session.

Carol Hoover, Chair of the Fellowship Committee reported the fellowship programs during 2019 were very successful and thank all who helped.

Stewardship and Finance Committee, Chaired by **James Meadows** reported that Clifton will receive the "Joy Offering" on December 22nd.

Venetta Wright, Chair of The Worship Committee reported the Worship Committee had planned the Thanksgiving meal; Advent Decorating; Christmas Eve Candlelight Service; and the 11:30 pm Christmas Eve Intinction Communion Service. She also reported that we would use "wee people", Poinsettias, and the Advent Wreath in the sanctuary again this year. The Worship Committee

also considered Super Bowl of Caring Sunday, February 2, 2020 and Lenten Lunches.

Larry Davis, Chair of the Mission Committee reported a "Helping Hands" tree would be in the narthex on December 15th, 22nd, and 29th. Donations placed on the tree will be used by public school officials to help meet the needs of students.

Kereshmeh Kashefian, Chair of the Outreach Committee reported on the cards she sent for the Session. She also reported on Clifton's web page and face book page. You can now donate at Clifton's web page.

Houston Arbuckle, Chair of the Crossroads Committee reported the committee invited Rich Cardot, pastor of a parish consisting of Belington, Beverly, Tygart's Valley, and Mill Creek Presbyterian churches, to speak to the members of our area churches who are interested in the parish concept. The session agreed to pay traveling expenses. The details have not yet been worked out.

As a connectional church Ron Miller feels it is important to stay involved with other churches. He has invited of Rev. Jeff Allen, Executive Director at West Virginia Council of Churches, to be the speaker at Clifton for Christian Unity Sunday (January 19, 2020) and hopes to invite Ed Thompson, General Presbyter of the Presbytery of WV to lead worship a Clifton in the near future. He also announced that he plans to in the office at Clifton at least half a day each week.

In Old Business, the session approved the "active roll" of Clifton with 71 active members. The session also approved a list of "others" (G-1.0404—Book of Order: Other Participants—Persons who are not members of, or who may have ceased active participation in, the Presbyterian Church (USA) are welcome and my participate in the life and worship of this church and receive its pastoral care and instruction.) There are 55 persons on our list of "Other Participants".

Pastoral concerns of the church were discussed and Larryetta Ellis adjourned the meeting with the prayer.
